


HAWAII 2024 CVR ANALYSIS





In my report, “Fingerprints of Fraud” (available at <https://fingerprintsoffraud.com>), I demonstrated how an unnatural and extremely unlikely pattern of voting was found in the Cast Vote Records (CVR) of hundreds of counties across the country. In summary, this pattern shows a large “dump” of Democrat-heavy mail-in ballots at the beginning of the counting, which sets the Republican at their lowest percentage within 30% of the count. The Republican percentage is then manipulated to rise gradually until it reaches its final value. In each of these counties, the Republican’s final mail-in percentage is between 1.1 and 1.3 (clustering around 1.2) their percentage at the middle of the counting. This degree of predictiveness and similarity has been conservatively estimated of at least 1 in 1.5 million, or approximately the same chance as being struck by lightning in any particular year.

Although the 2024 CVR data set is lower than 2020, the “Mesa Pattern” is rarely seen in 2024 CVR data, presumably because of the algorithm’s publicity. However, it does show up occasionally. Hawaii’s Cast Vote Records (produced by Hart Intercivic Election Management System) show the pattern in all four counties.


Below are graphs showing President Trump’s percentage of mail-in votes processed during the counting in all four counties. The “Back Half Ratio” is the difference between the President’s mail-in percentage at the midpoint and the end of the counting. The red “cone” shows where, statistically, the percentage should be based upon the assumption of pseudo-randomness (which was tested). The similarity between the counties is striking.








Most Cast Vote Records have no timestamps, only an order of the counting. The Hart Intercivic system separates the CVR into many small files, and these files do have creation timestamps, allowing us to determine the date they were processed. The following graph shows how many mail-in ballots were processed each day by county. (November 13th is omitted, where a few hundred votes were processed).



Honolulu started counting first, 4 days before the other counties started. Of interest is that 353,519 mail-in ballots (73% of the eventual total) were counted before election day. 128,249 were then processed on the 5th and 6th.

This graph shows the percentage of mail-in votes President Trump received each day by county (see legend at bottom).



This shows a general trend upwards as we approach election day, and then some remarkable results on the 5th and 6th. In particular, the 5th and 6th Honolulu County votes, where Harris received 36.9% of the mail vote, fell over 45% for President Trump, with him actually winning the mail vote counted on the 6th.

This strongly supports my theory that artificial Democrat mail-in votes are injected at or near the beginning of the counting, with the true vote being allowed to assert itself at the end (the 6th was, in my opinion, likely a correction to raise President Trump's percentage to the programmed outcome).

My analysis of the "split ticket" votes (voters who vote for candidates from different parties on the same ballot) is also disturbing, as it shows signs that down-ballot races were being suppressed.

My analysis of millions of ballots has shown that in federal or state races, normally 5-8% of voters nationwide will vote for candidates of different races. It is much more likely to see a voter not vote at all (an "undervote") or vote for a 3rd party candidate if they do not like a specific candidate in their party.

Statewide, the following shows how voters for President Trump voted in the Senate race.

An astounding 20% of Trump voters chose not to vote for Republican Bob McDermott, 15.8% (28,798) voting for the Democrat Hirono. This is an extreme outlier and deserves more analysis. The U.S. District 11 House race is even more surprising.

Only 76.1% of Trump voters voted for the Republican candidate, with 19.5% (18,305) voting for the Democrat. Conversely, voters for Bob McDermott for Senate and Steve Bond for the House supported President Trump at an expected level.

Harris voters voted for the Democrat in both of these races by rates of 95.2% and 96.3%, eliminating the possibility of chaotic vote switching by both parties.

Analysis of the data will continue, and it is my hope that the responsible parties in Hawaii will act quickly to investigate these anomalies and provide proof that they are not the indicators of fraud they seem to be.
